2014 saw us begining months of sourcing and tagging 34 magnificent Japanese Maples for a project in Amersham. Each year Hilliers, with whom we work very closely to source the very best trees, use the same individual Japanese Maples to form the backbone of their award winning display at Chelsea Flower Show.

Hence these trees are never normally for sale, but we were offered the chance to buy them, so imagine the pressure in planting these unique specimens. So special was the undertaking that a video of the work can be seen at...

Despite bitterly cold northeasterlies for several weeks in March and April and a very dry first six months, we only lost one tree; but the rest more than made up for this casualty, with a firework of flaming foliage from September right through into November.

Getting lost in 26 Acres

Being invited to work in the grounds of a 16th century manor house, which had been a family home since the 1940's, was quite a responsibility.

True there was plenty of room for our vans and delivery lorries but being sited next to a working gravel quarry gave us a clue to the underlying soil. Much was poor free-draining gravel and even the specimen Yew tree had suffered from years of competition from the surrounding grass, which had been over fertilised whilst the all important feeder roots of the Yew had been scalped repeatedly by the ride-on tractor. Dealing with these problems required much problem solving such that a set of measures were put in place to breathe new life into the Yew, as illustrated below....







Meanwhile the formal beds were completely reinvigorated following an ambitious plantin scheme devised by Jo Alderson Phillips and t uninspiring entrance was transformed by a st meadow (right).

LONDON CALLING

Living in the beautiful Goring Gap, the call of London is not strong, but we rose to the challenge of transforming this substantial garden in Holland Park. The garden had once been the pride and joy of the owners of the property, but having been rented out for several years, the mature trees and shrubs had a tired feel, compounded by the arrival of builders and scaffolding as the property underwent an ambitious 12 month restoration scheme.

It was however, a challenge to bring in by hand, 12 tons of an exactly specified graded loam, to create a lawn of bowling green quality, especially as it involved much climbing over and under the scaffolding. We were also to relay 100m2 of York stone and repoint the boundary wall before the borders could be replanted. The result was the rebirth of a stunning oasis in central London. Green and restful, you could (almost) be in the Goring Gap.







LOADS OF LOVE FOR LEO

Gardens should be a place of great beauty and give much pleasure, so when an opportunity arose to share my garden and at the same time raise money for my great-nephew Leo (pictured on the front page), who at the age of four months had been diagnosed with bladder cancer, it seemed a good time. But I have to say I did wonder on many occasions what people would think of my garden, having lived here for some 12 years, with a garden design van in the drive. Nevertheless Saturday 12th September saw 350 people descend upon the first ever opening of my garden. And crucially Leo came too, having just got back from eight weeks of cutting edge proton treatment in the US.

With the countless hours of meticulous work that had been completed by my guys and girls, by Jenks the tree surgeons who have worked with me for so long, Peppard Building Supplies topping up my gravel drive (free of charge), jars of honey from another client and garden furniture and bunting from another, the day was such great fun. And to add to the day for the numerous families who came, friends brought a variety of animals to create a petting zoo including donkeys, a parrot, guinea pigs and a six foot corn snake.



£1800 was raised on the day with another £1000 being donated before and after by people who could not come. Crucially Leo's all important scan, to see how effective his relentless treatment of chemo and radiotheraphy followed by the proton treatment, has shown the treatment to have been a success. The affection and generosity of so many people has really touched Leo's family and Claire and I would like to thank everyone for their support. And with many people asking 'would you do it again?' the answer is 'yes' for the garden has now been approved to be open on Saturday 10th September 2016 as part of the National Garden Scheme with monies being raised going towards Macmillan Nurses and Helen and Douglas House.
